Rescue from manure storage

NEVER, EVER go in after a victim, it is dangerous and deadly! Stay upwind of situation.

Notify County EMA 911 (dispatcher will activate "Technical Rescue Teams")

Rescue from confined space

(e.g. silos, grain bins)

DO NOT attempt rescue! Allow trained responders to do it.

Notify County EMA 911 (dispatcher will activate "Technical Rescue Teams" and possibly local HAZMAT team)

Overtaken tractor/equipment

Human entrapment

DO NOT attempt to lift tractor/equipment off of victim, let trained responders do it.

Notify County EMA 911 (dispatcher will activate "Technical Rescue Teams")

Agro-Terrorism incidents or Food Tampering

This guide has been developed to aid emergency dispatchers and emergency responders in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to manage incidents involving animals.

In general, in response to incidents involving animals:

- **DO NOT** chase animals
- **DO NOT** use sirens
- **Limit** use of emergency lights
- If there are a number of dead animals, do not enter the area

What is C.A.R.T.?

County Animal Response Team

Need animal behavior or general farm advice or assistance

Contact local, county Penn State Cooperative Extension Office

Escaped animals

Advice or assistance needed to safely corral animals and keep responders/public safe
Notify County EMA 911 (dispatcher will activate C.A.R.T.*)

Animal stuck in a hole, a well, or partially buried

Notify County EMA 911 (dispatcher will activate C.A.R.T.* and possibly Fire/Rescue or Technical Rescue)

Truck/trailer hauling animals overturns on roadway

Animals escaped, injured or dead

Notify county EMA 911 (dispatcher will activate C.A.R.T.*)

Notify PEMA Emergency Operations Center (24/7) PEMA will notify PA Dept of Agriculture and DEP (if burial is being considered)

Catastrophic loss of poultry or livestock due to fire or natural disaster
